At the International Blues Challenge in Memphis, the Blues was HOT! But the weather this February? Not so much ... it was near the freezing mark every day and those of us who had the sense to bring down-filled coats and multiple layers of fleece were very happy!

It was the year of the 'big storm' in the Midwest, and despite flight cancellations, every single competitor made it to Memphis! Our own connecting flight out of Chicago on Tuesday was the last flight to leave before O'Hare shut down until Thursday; unfortunately one suitcase didn't make it to Memphis until Friday!

This year, the OBS was represented in both the Band and the Solo/Duo categories ... and our first entry in the Solo/Duo - Brandon Agnew with Benny Gutman overcame technical difficulties (sound feedback) on the first night and won the crowd over with their persistence! Their second-night set, again in Wet Willie's, had one



audience member enthusing about the original lyrics. A friend from Baton Rouge said he was sure he'd seen Brandon busking in the Quarter in NOLA ... a very real possibility! Although they didn't advance to the Semi-Finals, our first entry in the Solo/Duo competition did us proud! Thanks to Brandon & Benny for a job well-done!

He brought it back to Ottawa with him and it's found a new home ... new owner Al Wood has fondly named it 'Memphis'!

Al & his Woodsmen put on two sizzling sets at the Rum Boogie Café and scored high enough to make it to semi-final competition on Friday night. It seemed to be 'harmonica night' at the Semi-Final in Alfred's; but it was the Randy Oxford Band, the only non-harmonica band that night, that went on to the finals at the Orpheum Theater on Saturday (no Canadian band made it).

Canada was well-represented in the **Solo/Duo finals** and **Harrison Kennedy** gave a wonderful, and very deserving, performance and placed second!



More Power to the DAWG!

101.9 DAWG FM has received approval from the C.R.T..C. for a power boost in order to improve the signal in the National Capital Region (C.R.T.C decision 2011-262).

DAWG FM launched on June 7, 2010 and quickly gained a large loyal audience. Todd Bernard, General Manager of DAWG FM, said "Today's decision from the C.R.T.C. is great news for our listeners and commercial advertisers. There will be considerable reception improvement in many residences and workplaces in both the city and suburbs. Engineering analyses conducted for our boost application predict that we will see a 31% increase in the number of residents reached within our coverage area."

Work at the station's transmitter site will commence shortly with completion expected before DAWG FM's first anniversary in June.

101.9 DAWG FM, operated by Torres Media Ottawa Inc., is Canada's first Blues radio station. The station plays Ottawa's best Rock, Blues, Soul and R&B.

International Blues Challenge 2012 - January 31 - February 4, 2012



The 2012 IBC will continue the four-day format, including 2 days of quarter finals (February 1-2), one day of semi-finals (February 3) and will conclude with finals in the beautiful Orpheum Theater on Saturday, February 4.

The week of events will once again kick off Tuesday night (January 31) with a Meet & Greet hosted by the Beale Street Merchants Association at the New Daisy Theater, followed by the FedEx International Showcase. In addition to the evening Blues competition, the days are filled with seminars and workshops and topped off in a moving Saturday morning brunch in which the Blues community will honour its own with the prestigious Keeping the Blues Alive (KBA) awards that honour the men and women who have made significant contributions to the Blues music world, in 20 categories such as journalism, literature and photography and to the best clubs and

festivals, as well as managers, promoters and producers.

The 2011 Blues Music Awards will take place Thursday May 5, 2011 at the Cook Convention Center in Memphis TN.



The 2011 show will follow the format of the critically-acclaimed shows of recent years. More than 65 nominees attend and the night is filled with their appearances and performances in a dinner table setting in the Convention Center's ballroom.

The event brings together Blues performers, industry representatives and fans from all over the world to celebrate the best in Blues recordings and performances from the previous year. Each year, the Foundation presents The Blues Music Awards to the artists selected by its members. They are universally recognized as the highest honour given to Blues artists. As always, a pre-party will immediately precede the Awards.



For the 4th consecutive year, The Blues Music Awards will be broadcast live in their entirety on Sirius XM's B.B. King's Bluesville - the next best thing to being there.



The Blues Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony and Charter Members' Dinner will be held on Wednesday, May 4.

The 2011 Blues Hall of Fame inductees include soulful singer/songwriter/guitarist Robert Cray, whose immense popularity helped jump start a contemporary blues scene; one of the world's premier acoustic blues artists, singer, guitarist, and harpist John Hammond; singer/songwriter Denise LaSalle, who, since her first hit, 'Trapped By A Thing Called Love' in 1971, has reigned as the Queen of Soul Blues; Big Maybelle, whose big voice made her one of the most important R&B vocalists of the 1950s; singer/songwriter, Alberta Hunter, the definition of class, a performer whose career spanned eight decades of blues and jazz; and singer/songwriter J.B. Lenoir whose iconic song 'Mama Talk To Your Daughter' is still relevant today.

Others being recognized are Vivian Carter and Jimmy Bracken, the 'Vee' and 'Jay' in Vee-Jay Records; noted African American educator, John W. Work, III; Samuel Charters, who led much of the 1960s blues revival in America through his writings and field recordings; and Bruce Bromberg, who has produced over 150 recordings. The book Walking to New Orleans: The Story of New Orleans Rhythm & Blues by John Broven will also be inducted.

Festival organizers are expecting another year of great attendance while offering a dynamic festival experience, for what *Billboard Magazine* has ranked as one of the top-10 music festivals in North America.

Once again, Canada's capital city will become a music Mecca during this two-week music extravaganza—drawing fans from far and wide. The festival site at LeBreton Flats Park offers a variety of food and merchandise concessions and is fully licensed. Tickets were to go on sale to the general public at 10 am Saturday, April 30.


Under the Radar

Featuring local blues musicians who may be 'under your radar'

Drummer Art Mak

I have been listening to blues since I was 12 years old. I have been playing blues drums since I was 14. I got JW-Jones into it around that age. I have a great collection of Blues records old magazines, photos ... JW still borrows things off me. In fact, I often give him ideas for artists. When it comes to Steve [Marriner], he plays a lot of that country stuff [my brother] Manny and I got into ... the older rock 'n' roll/country stuff ... when Steve was playing bass with us, he got into it. And now even JW plays a few songs that Manny and I showed him playing with Rock 'n' Roll Riot.

Manny and I recorded a full record with Kid Ramos, Lynwood Slim and Otis Grand. I was only 18 years old ... I skipped school to record it!



"Off the Wall Jive" - Mannie & the Swingin' Hipshakers ... Mannie Makris (vocals & guitar), Peter Sack (upright and electric bass), Art Makris (now shortened to Mak), drums; guest appearances by Kid Ramos (guitar), Otis Grand (guitar) & Lynwood Slim (vocals & harmonica).

There aren't many blues drummers out there ... some guys get by, but only a few focus on blues ... maybe three in the world (in my age group).

I have toured with JW-Jones, currently in Europe with him (April 2011) ... played with Steve for years ... toured/played With Kid Ramos, Kenny Blues Boss, Lynwood Slim, Nick Curran, Phil Alvin, Deke Dickerson, Big Sandy, Eddie Nichols, Albert Lee, James Intveld ... and the plan in the future is the Blasters and Kim Wilson - both have asked me for feature work.

I have been heavily into blues more than anyone I know around here. Shhhhh, don't tell JW that!

The Ottawa Premiere of "Music from the Big House" was co-presented by the Ottawa Blues Society.

This powerful documentary has been touring in Canada and the United States for the last several months, to enthusiastic reviews and raves from blues fans across the two countries. It documents a rare and exclusive musical journey. Rita Chiarelli, an award-winning recording artist, decided to take a pilgrimage to the birthplace of the blues — Louisiana State Maximum Security Penitentiary aka Angola Prison. She never imagined that her love of the blues would lead her to play with inmates serving life sentences for murder, rape and armed robbery. In what was once the bloodiest prison in America, inmates relatives were invited to listen alongside other prisoners, to hear remarkable voices singing stories of hope and redemption.

The soundtrack, recorded live at Louisiana State Penitentiary, has just been released and is available from the website. The DVD will be available in 2012.

"Dust Bowl" - Joe Bonamassa

Joe Bonamassa, Billboard's Blues artist of 2010, has released "Dust Bowl", his 12th solo album, in a career that

spans over 20 years. A child prodigy, he was opening shows for the likes of Buddy Guy, Robert Cray and Gregg Allman by the time he was 12 years old.

Dust Bowl combines his usual dose of searing blues, heavy rock, as well as boot-stomping country. Guest starring with Joe on this CD are legends Vince Gill and John Hiatt; a little touch of Nashville is quite evident when listening to 'Tennessee Plates' and 'Sweet Rowena'. Other standout tracks are 'Slow Train' and an old-style British Blues tune, 'Black Lung Heartache' and as well as 'The Meaning of the Blues'. One track that may sound familiar to some was the CD's final song, 'Prisoner'. My wife found herself singing along to it without knowing where she may have heard the song before. Upon researching who might have sung this song before, she discovered that it was Barbara Streisand, who did this song on the soundtrack of the movie "Eyes of Laura Mars".

This is a must for any Blues fan as this CD is rooted in the blues but explores the limits of this genre and showcases Bonamassa's amazing talent as a guitarist.


