Two rounds of Semi-Final competition for The Ottawa Blues Society's 2nd Annual 'On the Road to Memphis' local blues challenge took place September 16 and 23.

Todd Bernard (DAWG-FM, Canada & North America's first all blues commercial radio station scheduled to be on air in Summer 2010) acted as Master of Ceremonies. Throughout the competitions, each band's 25-minute performance was judged by the same criteria used for the International Blues Challenge in Memphis.

Judging by the crowds who attended (both the lucky ones indoors and those lined up outdoors), the finale (on Friday, September 25 at Tucson's) was a huge success! Advancing to the Finals competition for the opportunity to represent Ottawa in Memphis were Phlegm, The Jesse Green Band, Mumbo Jumbo Voodoo Combo and the Drew Nelson Band. Volunteer judges for the Finals included: Fred Litwin (Northern Blues Music), Lynn Saxberg (Ottawa Citizen), Alexandre Petit, (Virée Blues Boréale), and Ottawa's own JW-Jones (Blues Musician).



In recognition of their tireless efforts to bring blues music to Ottawa 24/7, 365 days a year, the Ottawa Blues Society President Liz Sykes and Vice President Mike Graham presented the Blues Heart Award for 2008 and 2009 to Ed Torres and Todd Bernard from DAWG-FM.

The Blues Foundation will present the 26th International Blues Challenge January 20-23, 2010 in Memphis, TN. Blues musicians from around the world compete for cash, prizes, and industry recognition.

The contest begins months before at dozens of regional "battles of the bands" presented by the Foundation's 165 Affiliated Organizations. The winners of these preliminaries are matched in head-to-head juried competition for the chance to take their band or solo/duo act to the international stage.

In 2010, 100 bands and 60 solo/duo acts are entered and will fill the clubs up and down Beale Street for the semi-finals on Thursday and Friday and the finals at the Orpheum

The IBC weekend also features the only international conference for Blues societies, offering networking and problem-solving opportunities not found elsewhere.

All non-musical events will be at the Doubletree Hotel, 185 Union Avenue, unless otherwise noted. The Blues Foundation will be headquartered in the Doubletree lobby during the day and the Handy Park Bar at night.

HISTORICAL PRESERVATION:

Eric LeBlanc combined his love of blues, jazz, and discographical Flohil has been data. Though he has been active since 1968 in blues radio in Canada, Eric understood that proper verification of the music's first appearances in vital statistics is necessary. Thus he has been collecting and sharing vital data and documentation that have been an essential part of the music

books and magazines we read. The print publications Goldmine, Down Beat, Blues & Rhythm, Living Blues, and Juke Blues are some that have relied on his data. Since the early 1990s, he has been providing fans and researchers on various listservs with data to verify performers' names, important dates, and discographical data. The principal ways to access his work have been through www.bluesworld.com and Pre-war-blues@yahoogroups.com. Since retiring in 2005 from the Herzberg Institute of Astrophysics, he has joined the Jazz Faculty of The Victoria Conservatory of Music, teaching the Jazz & Blues Survey courses. In 2010, Eric co-authored, with Bob Eagle, the Blues volume in the Greenwood Press Guides to American Roots Music.

PUBLICIST: For more than 50 years, Richard committed to the blues. As a concert promoter, he was involved with the Canada (in the late '50s and early '60s) of Sleepy John Estes, Robert Nighthawk, Muddy



Waters, Bobby Bland, and Buddy Guy, among others. He started his first publicity company, Richard Flohil and Associates, in 1970. In the years since, he has handled the Canadian publicity for Canada's leading blues and roots-music record label, Stony Plain Records, whose roster includes Duke Robillard, Maria Muldaur, Amos Garrett, Ronnie Earl, Big Dave McLean, the late Long John Baldry, and others. Some of his current clients include Shakura S'Aida, Roxanne Potvin, Paul Reddick, Treasa Levasseur, and the estate of the late Jeff Healey, for whom he worked for five years; Flohil also handled publicity for Canada's Downchild Blues Band for 39 years. Flohil served on the board of the Toronto Blues Society for 12 years, and remains a member of its programming committee. He continues to work as a club and concert presenter.





The Blues Foundation will present the 31st Blues Music Awards on May 6, 2010, at the Cook Convention Center in Memphis, TN. Performers, industry representatives and fans will celebrate the best in Blues recording and performance from 2009.

Among those heading the list of honorees is Joe Louis Walker, who garnered five nominations, including Album of the Year, Contemporary Blues Album of the Year, and Song of the Year for 'I'm Tide' from his recent release "Between a Rock and the Blues". Tommy Castro, Rick Estrin, Louisiana Red, Duke Robillard and Super Chikan each received four nominations.

Almost every nominee will be in attendance and perform so it's safe to say it will be one of the best shows of the year; where else do you get the chance to see a lineup including the best of the best in blues all in one evening.

In addition to Ottawa's own MonkeyJunk, nominated for Best New Artist Debut, there are several other Canadian-related nominations (listed below). OBS Corporate member Stony Plain Records has a dozen nominations for four different artists/projects: Joe Louis Walker, Duke Robillard, Ronnie Earl and Maria Muldaur. Another OBS Corporate member Northern Blues Records received two nominations for Samuel James. And Vancouver's Black Hen Music was nominated for the tribute to the Mississippi Sheiks CD, "Things About Comin' My Way".

The Maple Blues Awards is Canada's national blues awards program. Its goal is to promote blues music across Canada, and to recognize outstanding achievement in the field.

Ottawa's MonkeyJunk received six nominations and Vancouver's The Twisters received five. Swamp Boogieband MonkeyJunk received nods in the Entertainer of the Year, Electric Act of the Year, and Recording of the Year, for their record "Tiger In Your

Tank", categories as well as Male Vocalist of the Year and Harmonica Player of the Year for Steve Marriner and Guitar Player of the Year for Tony D. The Twisters are nominated for Electric Act of the Year, Recording of the Year for "Come Out Swingin", Harmonica Player of the Year for David Hoerl, Keith Picot for Bass Player of the Year, and Songwriter of the Year for Brandon Isaak.

Close behind is Hamilton, Ontario's Harrison Kennedy receiving four nominations for Acoustic Act of the Year, Male Vocalist of the Year, Songwriter of the Year, and Recording of the Year for his record, "One Dog Barkin". Downchild and its members have earned four nominations between them. Whitby's local Guitar Slinger Jack de Keyzer received three nominations including Guitarist of the Year. Toronto's Paul Reddick received three nominations including Recording of the Year for "Sugarbird". From Dartmouth, Nova Scotia, Garrett Mason picked up two nominations for Electric Act of the Year and Guitarist of the Year. Easley, Stevenson, Arsenault from Nova Scotia picked up nominations for Bassist of the Year, Piano/Keyboard Player Of The Year, and Drummer of the Year.

New Artist of the Year nominees include Toronto's Blackburn, Montreal's Blues Delight, Quebec City's Clio & The Blues Highway, Fredericton's Ross Neilsen, and Toronto's Scott McCord & The Bonafide Truth. A full list of nominees appears at http://www.mapleblues.ca/.

This year's winners will be announced at the 13th Annual Maple Blues Awards Gala in Toronto, on January 18, 2010 at Koerner Hall. This very special evening is Canada's national annual celebration of homegrown blues talent. It's also a night of great music by the Maple Blues Band, comprised entirely of Maple Blues Awards winners and nominees.

Koerner Hall is the newest addition to Toronto's fine list of cultural centres and theatres. The intimate and elegant hall opened in September 2009 with 1,140 seats and features state-of-the-art acoustic treatment.

Danny Marks, Host of BLUZ FM and David Gogo, Cordova Bay Recording Artist, will be hosting the Maple Blues Awards.

Whispering Pines: The Northern Roots of American Music from Hank Snow to The Band

Providing the first comprehensive history of Canada's songwriting legacy, this guide traces a distinctly Canadian musical identity from the 1930s to the end of the 1970s. The discussion shows how Canadian musicians have always struggled to create work that reflects their own environment while simultaneously connecting with mass audiences in other countries, particularly the United States. While nearly all songwriters who successfully crossed this divide did so by immersing themselves in the American and British forms of blues, folk, country, and rock 'n' roll, this guide reveals that Canadian sensibilities were never far beneath the surface.

This book is a compilation of short memoirs of the musicians he recorded. It's been a long time coming, but Ferris promised many of them that their stories would be published.

From concert performances and studio sessions to interviews and intimate club shows, Flerlage's images effortlessly capture the essence of both the artists and their music. Arresting photographs of popular performers, such as Bob Dylan, Joan Baez, and Pete Seeger, mingle with those of more traditional musicians, including the Reverend Gary Davis, Booker White, Dock Boggs, and Mother Maybelle Carter as well as many other blues, bluegrass, Cajun, and gospel artists who performed at the University of Chicago Folk Festival.



Lachute (1 ½ hours drive from Ottawa-Gatineau) held it first blues festival this year, with proceeds going to the Canadian Cancer Society. The main stage was on the outskirts of the city; resto-bar shows (7 resto-bars

participated in the festival) were downtown. However, there was plenty of parking next to the main stage and a free shuttle bus service "Le Blues Express" between the main stage and downtown from 12 noon to 2:30 am. There were the usual beer tent & food vendors: I didn't sample the food there but did have dinner at Le Vieux Charbon downtown Saturday evening and the food, as well as the wine, were excellent.

I arrived at the main stage Friday evening in time for the festival's headliner, Offenbach, French America's top rock/blues band. Offenbach's debut goes back to



1962 when the group Double Tones was formed; in the 70s, after many changes in band became the top rock band in Quebec and the only group offering genuine bluesy rock 'n' roll. To this day, Offenbach remains the biggest

rock 'n' blues band in Quebec's history. They were also the first Quebec group to perform at the Montreal forum - with John Mayall on April 3, 1980, and also shared the forum stage with Joe Cocker in June 1981. Band members at the Lachute show were: Jean 'Johnny' Gravel (lead guitar), John McGale (vocals, guitar, sax, flute), Éric Sauvé from Gatineau (piano), Bob St. Laurent (vocals, drums) and Robby Bolduc (bass); they put on an awesome show. John McGale also performed at Le Vieux Charbon; you can see a clip of his delightful performance on the festival website.

After Offenbach, I caught one set of the Adam Karch's show; an excellent guitarist/singer/song-writer in the folk/blues style whose talent and beautiful compositions impressed the

audience.

On to Le Vieux Charbon where Blues Berry Jam were playing. They were fabulous! The lead singer was a woman. High energy honest Blues from a female

perspective, delivered with passion, soul and a perfect voice for Blues; that's pretty special indeed. This group, with Nancy Desmarais as lead singer, opened up for Colin James in Laval and Joliette in 2005. You can see

After Blues Berry Jam's show, I found one group still playing at Le Caucus. Upside Down is another great band with a great female lead singer! There was a party going on ... the place was packed (without being overcrowded) and everybody, and I mean everybody, was dancing. The ambience was exceptional ... love and happiness were in the air... one of those special rare magical nights.

On Saturday, the last day of the festival, I skipped the main stage acts because of the rain and cold weather, but one show I didn't want to miss was **Steve Rowe** at members and name, Offenbach Le Vieux Charbon that evening. Anyone who's heard



this fine guitarist knows that with Steve Rowe, you get a great show. Steve's newest release, "FIVE", has received worldwide critical acclaim from New York's Elmore Magazine, Toronto's Maple Blues Magazine, Montreal's Words & Music, and was broadcast on over 200 American radio stations within

two months of its US release. It has earned him US recognition hitting The Living Blues Chart at #20, and Steve and his band were nominated for five of Quebec's prestigious Lys Blues Awards. As always, Steve

delivered an outstanding trueblue Blues show. Playing with Steve were Paul Grondin on bass, Paul-André Lamarche on drums and guesting that night was Brian Cober from Toronto on double-slide guitar. All fine musicians, a very tight band



feeding off one another and having the best time; you just can't beat that... and of course, it's highly contagious... they kept people on the dance floor from start to finish. What a show! A very fitting finale for a fantastic festival. Lachute en Blues rocks!




